

As Historians:

As Geographers:

- Improve locational knowledge by studying latitude, longitude, the Equator, hemispheres, Tropics, polar circles, the Greenwich Meridian and time zones
- Use maps, atlases, globes and digital mapping to locate features
- Use the eight points of the compass

- Develop listening and improvisation skills
- Study Beethoven's Fifth Symphony
- Prepare to sing and perform at Christmas

- Build stamina, range and personal taste as individual readers
- In spelling, continue to hone phonetic choices and master statutory spellings and common spelling patterns
- Practise writing to entertain, inform and persuade, and increasingly draft, critique and edit work
- Explore word families and affixes while consolidating KS1 grammar and punctuation objectives

- Develop skills in gymnastics, zumba, agility and balance

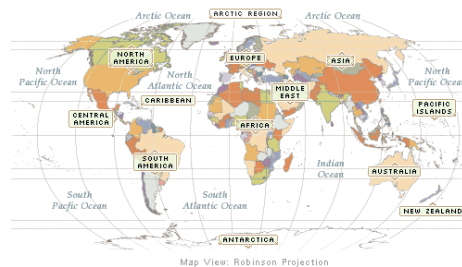
